

Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) Statement

POPs Definition

Persistent organic pollutants (POPs) are organic substances that persist in the environment, accumulate in living organisms and pose a risk to our health and the environment. They can be transported by air, water or migratory species across international borders, reaching regions where they have never been produced or used.

The Stockholm Convention Persistent Organic Pollutants Review Committee (POPRC) reviews and updates the Stockholm Convention's list of persistent organic pollutants (POPs) which details the substances that are eliminated, restricted or subject to limitations. Cambion monitors this list in conjunction with the requirements of Regulation (EU) 2019/1021 on persistent organic pollutants and The Persistent Organic Pollutants Regulations 2007.

Declaration

At the date of issue, to the best of our knowledge, Cambion makes the declaration that substances, processes and materials used in the manufacture of products at its facilities do not intentionally contain persistent organic pollutants (POPs).

To ensure compliance with the requirements of Article 7 of Regulation (EU) 2019/1021 on persistent organic pollutants, Cambion periodically reviews the requirements against our products line.

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
